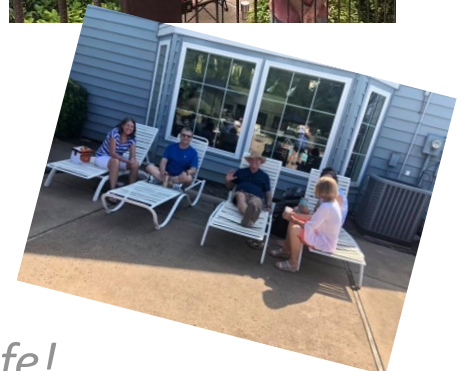

Our first responder honored guests included TRWD Police Officers, FWPD Officer Woody (NPO), and Fort Worth Fire Dept. Truck #40 and Firefighters. Note that in August we also had a Crime Watch Forum with Officer Ralph Salazar (our NPO) and Dorothy Tyler (FWPD Crime Watch Specialist) that was very informative.

Donna Clay's Social Committee prepared packaged hot dogs, chips, brownies & cookies, plus water and iced tea. The hot dogs were grilled by Larry McCracken and Craig Lashley. In addition to the speakers and police & fire emergency vehicles, there were Crime Watch materials about neighborhood safety. From The Landing HOA President

Dear Residents and Neighbors,

By the time you read this letter, it will almost be Christmas, and we will be approaching the new year. Where has this year gone? This year has been very productive and we have accomplished a lot of work together evident throughout our community. Each month we have shared accomplishments of all that make it possible through everyone's kind and generous "spirit" (service, performance, integrity, respect, innovation and teamwork).

In February, we were still in the pandemic, experiencing one of the coldest weeks on record with no electricity and no water. The kindness and generosity of our neighbors helped many families sharing food, water and firewood. The weather damaged many of our trees and vegetation. In early March, the board implemented virtual meetings using ZOOM, began documenting policy and procedures, created a community share link and issued an "open call for volunteers" to work collaboratively on specific actions that would unify and improve our community. By April, committees were formed and charters written. The web site was updated for better communication and easier navigation. The social team hit the ground planning events that would bring families and community together. Their efforts combined with the generosity of our neighbors made a difference outside the Landing providing children in need school supplies, food, and toys. In June, the Bylaws Committee was well into their research of our governing documents to become compliant with the 2021 Texas Property Code. The Landscape team worked endless hours through November with the clearing and removal of damaged vegetation and some trees, acquiring new trees, getting them planted and watered. ACC experienced a higher record in home improvement requests. The Irrigation team worked tirelessly to repair and renew our systems. Increased activity at our marina and on the lake was evident. The Neighborhood Watch (-ful eye) continued around our neighborhood.

Updates to the pool area were completed, new signage and playground equipment installed. Successful clean-up days around the lake and our community common grounds brought neighbors together working side by side. The clubhouse was painted, lights repaired, the ceiling repaired, fixtures replaced, beds landscaped, fences cleaned and fences painted.

Before the end of the year, the Board will be presenting the membership a consideration/vote for four legal documents that include the ACC Guidelines, the Articles, the Declaration of Covenants and the Bylaws which will provide for a more cohesive community.

Thank you for continuing your support and giving "spirit" as we approach 2022. Wishing all of you a very Merry Christmas and safe New Year!
