FROM THE LANDING HOA MANAGER

Dear Residents,

With the warm weather a lot more people will be walking, children riding bikes and playing, walking dogs, etc., please read all the regulations for our community as a refresher. Also, please be aware that a lot of our regulations follow the ordinances of the City of Fort Worth. Not only do you violate the Landing rules but the City can issue citations if you are not in compliance.

<u>Dogs</u>: For your convenience, we now have **3 dog waste stations** around the neighborhood. There is one in each

park and one in the field at the corner of Fair Haven St. and Fair Haven Ct. This should make dog walking easier. Please tie a knot in the used individual bags before you toss them into the waste can. Neglecting to do so can make a big



mess. Also remember that the City of Fort Worth has a leash law. If your dog is off property, it needs to be on a leash. This includes all common areas, even our two parks. Willow Creek park in Saginaw has a great dog park, if you want your dog to be able to run leashless. It is close and well maintained, and there is a small dog area and a separate large dog area.

- All trash cans need to be placed out of sight by midnight of the collection day (City Ordinance).
- Keep all yards and flowerbeds in a maintained condition.
- Slow down when driving through the community for safety of all residents.
- Do not park in areas that hinder others from access to their driveways.
- Do not park in circles where Emergency or City vehicles cannot get by.
- Please refresh yourself with the rules pertaining to our pool, tennis courts and boat ramp.
- Any changes to the exterior of your home needs approval from the ACC with the proper form.
- Driving golf carts in the park, or any grassy common area and on the barrier reef are not allowed.
- Please do not feed the ducks bread, please see the picture below. If you choose to feed the ducks, please follow the directions in the picture and be sure it is on your own property. Please do not leave food in the parks and other areas for the ducks.
